3) The assessment report was duly placed in the 131st Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 04.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission for UG in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as 1st Renewal of Permission was issued to the college with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic year 2024-25; but is fulfilling the criteria for Extended Permission for 06 PG courses as per Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 30 Seats in 06 PG courses. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:

- to issue Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2nd renewal of permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- to issue Extended Permission in 06 PG courses with 30 seats in subjects namely i)Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, ii)Panchakarma- 05 seats, iii)Shalya Tantra-05 seats, iv)Rachna Sharir- 05 seats, v)Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana-05 seats, vi)Kayachikitsa-05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024; under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.


4) Therefore, Shri Shivayogeshwar Rural Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Tq:-Saundatti, Distt.-Belgaum, Inchal - 591102 Karnataka (Inst. ID-AYU0072) is hereby granted with :-

- Yearly Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2nd renewal of permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 61 to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- Extended Permission in 06 PG courses with 30 seats in subjects namely i)Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, ii)Panchakarma- 05 seats, iii)Shalya Tantra-05 seats, iv)Rachna Sharir-05 seats, v)Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana-05 seats, vi)Kayachikitsa-05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

5) The aforementioned permission is issued under section 28 & 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 30 Seats in 06 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted there under.**
- II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made there under should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
- v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.
- vi) Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 10) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
